PURPOSE

To educate healthcare providers about opioid use disorder (OUD) within hospital settings, how to manage withdrawal symptoms as well as initiating and continuing medication for OUD (MOUD) for patients interested in such treatment options.

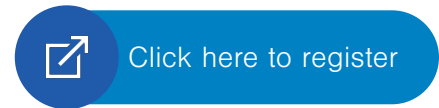
DESCRIPTION

Practices of the past have primarily focused on detoxing the patient. However, for patients with OUD, a medical detox leaves patients at a greater risk of experiencing a fatal overdose when discharged. This webinar will present ways to standardize care across hospital settings be it the emergency department, inpatient or medical stabilization.
